Professor Trevor A. Kletz, Adjunct Professor of Chemical Engineering at Texas A&M University, is known throughout the process industries as a gifted communicator on safety matters. After receiving his degree in chemistry, Dr. Kletz joined Imperial Chemical Industries and spent eight years in research, sixteen in production management, and the last fourteen as safety advisor to the Petrochemicals Division. Upon retiring from ICI after 38 years of service, he joined Loughborough University of Technology, initially in a full-time position and later as a Visiting Fellow. Dr. Kletz has written ten books, more than 100 papers, and over 300 articles on process safety and loss prevention. He is a Fellow of the Royal Academy of Engineering, the Institution of Chemical Engineers, and the Royal Society of Chemistry.
